Representative Walorski, CDC director visit local company

CDC Executive Director Nathan P. Origer recently accompanied Congresswoman Jackie Walorski (IN-02) and members of her staff on a tour of US Aggregates's Francesville quarry. Meeting with corporate and local-plant staff, Rep. Walorski addressed federal transportation funding and controversial changes proposed by the Environmental Protection Agency to the definition of "waters of the United States". US Aggregates staff were gracious hosts, offering water and homemade cookies, and the congresswoman was an engaged and interested visitor. Following the brief meeting, the group descended 300 feet to the current bottom of the pit, which offers exceptional views.

Indianapolis-based US Aggregates, a member of the Heritage Group of companies, employs about 250 at its seventeen Indiana plants, about 10 percent of them at Francesville. The company's secondlargest facility, the local quarry has a not-yet-tapped annual capacity of about 1.5 million tons per year. It produces septic stone, stone for concrete, and agricultural lime, amongst other offerings.
